Working with the Homeless Education Program of LAUSD, the ALF Community Needs Assessment and Outreach Committee proposed purchasing hygiene kits for homeless students in Sunland-Tujunga. Committee chair was Linda Gill. Members included Rosalind Hilton, Barbara Mello, Mary Mieding and Maureen Swenson. ALF members enthusiastically approved the gift and voted to allocate the necessary funds.

The kits were delivered to the ALF Chapter House in La Cañada Flintridge, where ALF members organized and packaged the kits for delivery. Members of Retired Service Volunteers, an ALF philanthropic program for seniors who meet to work on tasks for other nonprofit organizations, also participated in the project. In coordination with LAUSD, the kits were distributed to students in elementary through high school.

Contents of the kits include needed items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, hairbrushes and soap, with deodorant and feminine hygiene supplies added for high school students.

At the May Assistance League of Flintridge membership meeting, Katie Rivezzo and Leah Jackson, Pupil Services counselors for the LAUSD Homeless Education Program, were invited to speak to ALF members about the chapter's donation of hygiene kits. Rivezzo and Jackson expressed their thanks and presented a Certificate of Appreciation to ALF.
